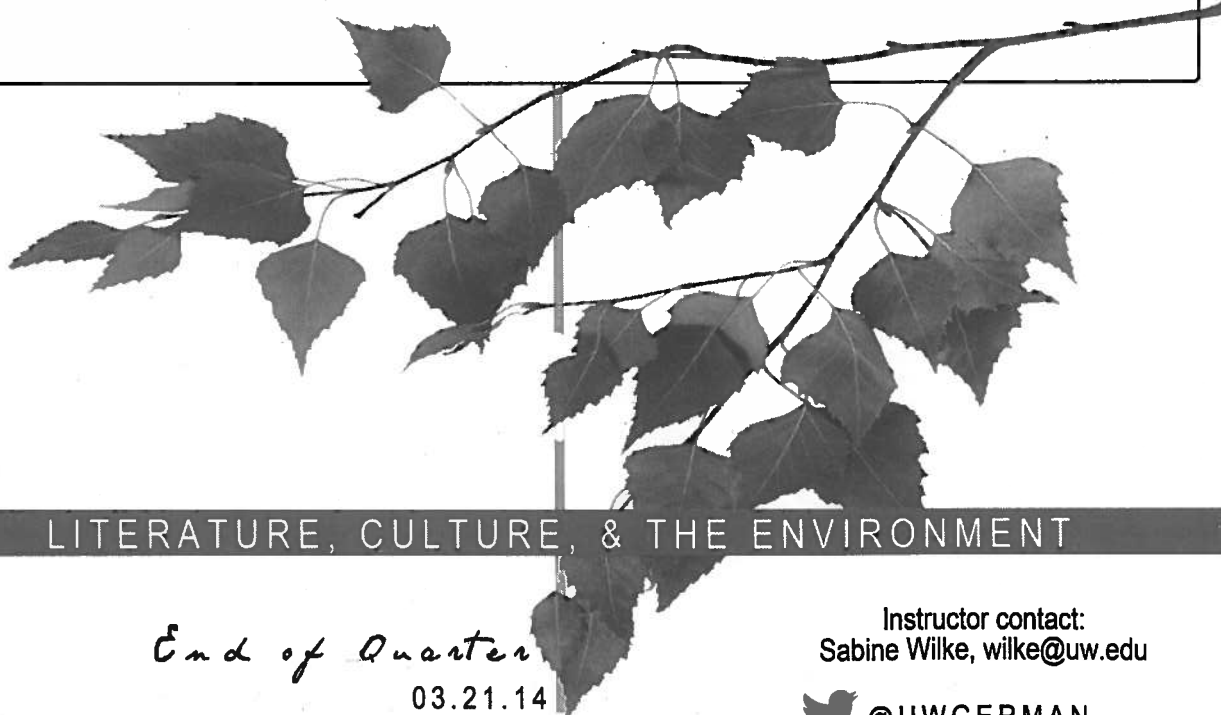

Literature, culture, and the environment are explored in their interlinkages along five examples: the study of food and consumption, animals and the post-human perspective, waste, climate change, and the question of diversity in the Anthropocene. The Anthropocene is a concept that describes the scale of human impact on the Earth. The idea is that human impact is growing in the area of land use, ecosystems, biodiversity, climate, and species extinction. We will explore the cultural dimension of the concept of the Anthropocene and how the study of literature and culture can contribute to an understanding of the historical, ethical, and aesthetic dimension of this new era of the human.
